

Nonprofit starts expansion project

HANOVER TWP.: A not-for-profit agency providing employment services for the disabled in Morris County has officially begun its new expansion project.

Employment Horizons broke ground yesterday on a 22,000-square foot addition to its Cedar Knolls building, to house a new cafeteria and provide additional space for job training.

Maria Verducci-Florio, capital campaign director, said the expansion is crucial to helping individuals meet the changing demands of today's job market.

The agency, which currently serves over 550 individuals with special needs each year, has been forced to turn away locals seeking its services due to space limitations, agency executives said.

So far, Employment Horizons has raised about \$1.5 million out of an anticipated \$5 million needed for the project.
